Reflecting Back, Looking Forward

Paul writes in Philippians 4:8 “Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.” As we take a moment and reflect on 2021, I can’t help but praise our Heavenly Father for what He has done and is doing around the world. I have witnessed the noble characters of our mission partners who are on the front line in hostile situations sharing the gospel with excellence. I am encouraged by remembering the stories of lives changed and lives saved because of aid IDES was able to provide such as: large-scale hunger relief, hurricane and typhoon relief, tornado relief, fires, floods, volcanoes, drought, life-saving surgeries and medications, ongoing relief in two countries taken over by coups, work in numerous closed countries, sustainable farms and livestock programs, leadership training, homes rebuilt, and Bibles distributed. I can see the faces and hear the voices of many who received aid. And I am reminded of one more thing.

Every story is about something more than just what IDES was able to do. Every story reminds me of the incredible things God has accomplished. These stories are filled with hope that only God provides. I think of those who were provided encouragement; people who heard help was provided simply because Christians loved and cared for them. I remember the churches that made big impacts in their communities and mission partners who were able to continue sharing about our Savior. I am able to pause and reflect on the people I know of who gave their lives to Christ. The scope of impact is so large that only God could have made it possible.

As I reflect on God’s provision I am excited and confident about the future He has put before IDES. When we pray for big opportunities to show God’s love, and we are bold to respond to the opportunities He puts before us, He is faithful to provide and add to His Kingdom. We have seen it over and over. It is reflected in this Annual Report and is playing out in the future plans IDES is putting together.

Everything IDES does is to Glorify God. Thank you for being part of what God is doing here in the US and around the world!

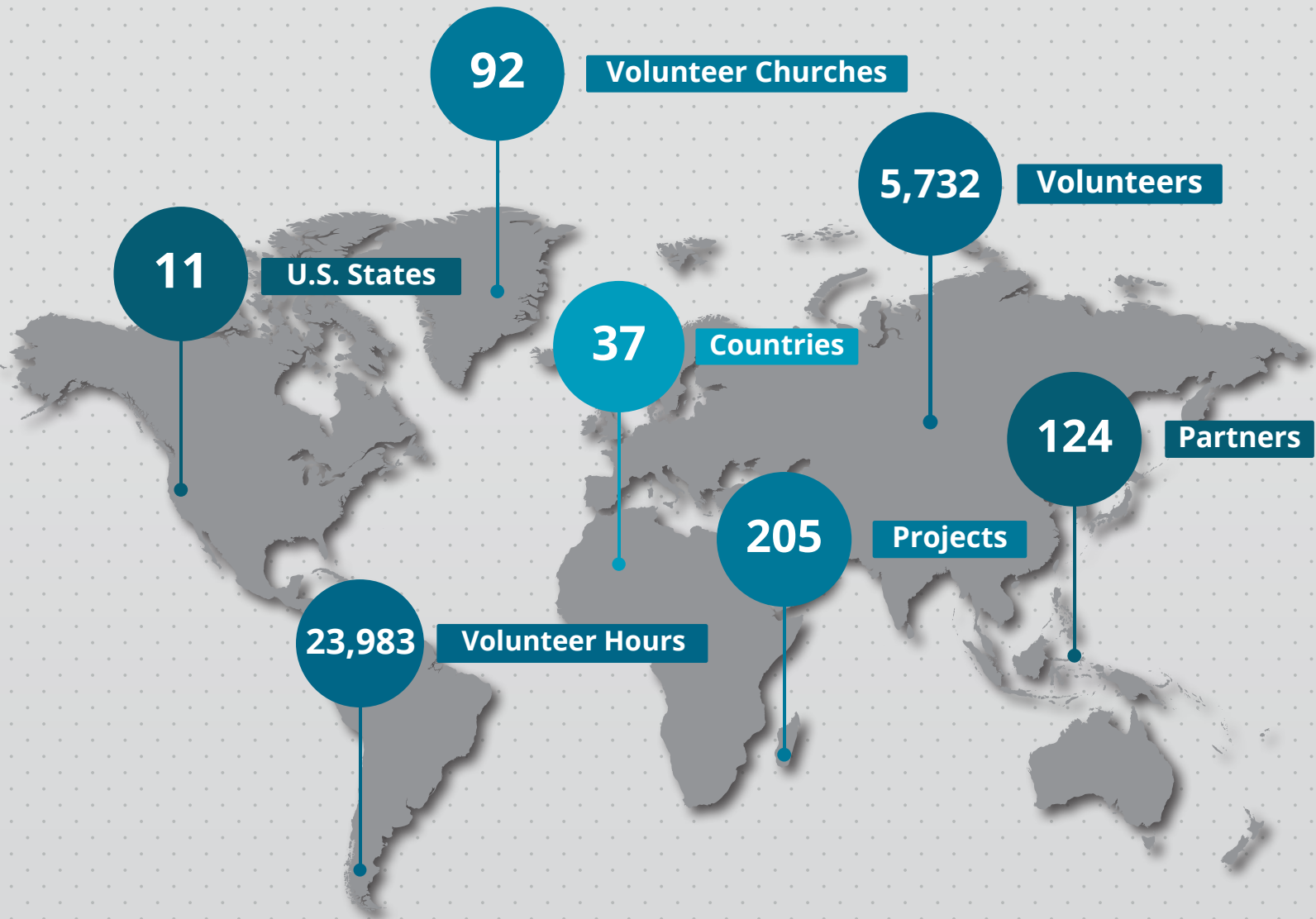

Visiting the Farms

One of my biggest takeaways from our trip to the Turkana region of Kenya was just how remote these farms are. Getting to these farms is no easy task as you're not driving on roads per say, but rather dirt and sandy paths, relying on a good sense of direction in order to avoid getting lost.

Clean water is scarce and hydrating is important to avoid dehydration in temperatures in the 100s. As we drove through the desert landscape we passed by several caravans of camels along the two-hour journey, stopping for lunch under a tree, one of the few shady spots. The conditions and climate of the area don't seem ideal for farming, but when we finally arrived and started touring the farms, I couldn't believe how lush and green they were.

Row after row of vegetables and fruits growing in this desert. All guarded by a perimeter fence from wood sticks to keep nearby goats and camels out.

Water hoses were stretched throughout the farms for irrigation and clean drinking water. Inside these farms were not just crops, but also families of beautiful people who had such a sense of community and were so grateful for these farms and the ability to produce crops. This has not only affected them with physical nourishment, but spiritual as well.

I saw three of IDES focus areas in action with these farms. Providing hunger relief, community development with the ability to sell these crops for income, and how the farms are used for evangelism which is the main reason we do what we do.

Last year one of our mission partners came to visit us. This godly couple serves in a country where there are only a handful of known believers. Christians face the daily threat of persecution, and evangelistic work is not permitted.

Yet, they are finding ways to make the love of Christ known, and to impart the hope He brings to all who trust in Him. As they described their vision for meeting a set of needs in partnership with IDES, we were moved with excitement for what God may be calling us to do together.

We were enthused, but a perplexing thought also crossed our minds: “How will IDES be able to raise support for an ambitious project when we cannot even share its location?”

All of that took place on a Wednesday morning. As we went about our work that afternoon, we began to pray for God’s guidance and His provision. If we were going to embrace this opportunity, then God would need to show us the way forward.

On Friday, He did. As we were preparing to head out for the weekend, just moments before we shut off the lights, the phone rang. On the line was a good friend of IDES who has lovingly supported our ministry over the years. He had previously shared with us that he plans to include a gift to IDES in his will, a gift which will one day help carry on our work of offering help and hope to a hurting world.

Our friend, said “The Lord got me thinking yesterday, I don’t want you to have to wait until He calls me home to receive the full amount of the gift

we talked about. So, I drove to the bank where I have that money and took out enough to help you a little right now.” When he shared the value of the gift he was sending, it was exactly the amount we had been praying for!

We asked permission to use his generous gift for the proposed project, and he joyfully agreed. We don’t get to witness such immediate answers to prayer every day. But when we do, it is a powerful reminder that we serve a loving and merciful God who loves all those who are created in His image, a mighty God who hears and answers the prayers of His people!

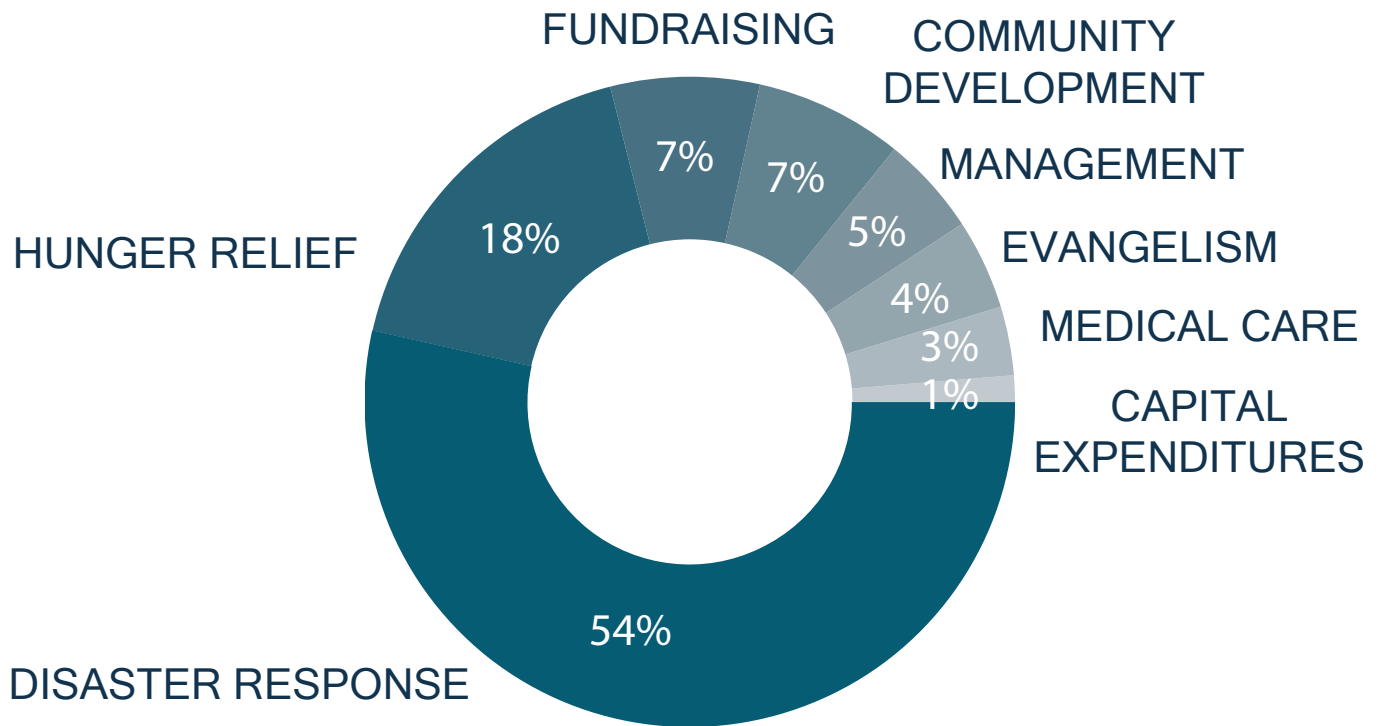

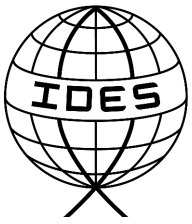
