Over the last year (IDES' 50th Anniversary) God has been preparing us for Expanding Help and Hope. As we Expand Help and Hope to meet the needs of hurting people all over the world, we are seeing our US Response increase dramatically and with great purpose, increasing our reach around the country as we partner with amazing churches to meet needs in their communities following disasters that strike.

Our global response has grown to the point that our headquarters in Noblesville has reached capacity. Join me in praying as we look to expand our facility so we can continue meeting needs into the future. IDES' International Aid has grown and we are excited to have our first International Field Workers serving in long-term community development and discipleship around the world. These teams strive continuously to meet humanitarian needs and will speed up our response time to help more people receive critical aid in times of crisis. We are thrilled about this expansion of our international response.

The first of 50 Churches for 50 Years churches is being built right now in India. These churches highlight the impact of how meeting physical needs leads to spiritual hope and the planting of new churches to continue sharing the gospel. Right now three churches are breaking ground and there is a list of many more that will be started as soon as they are funded.

Disaster Response

IDES works in partnership with Christ's servants around the globe to care for victims of natural disasters, man made disasters, violence and oppression. Our assistance includes distributing essential supplies like food, water, and clothing, rebuilding homes and church buildings, and providing storage sheds.



Floods in Southeast Asia

In a country in southeast Asia, major flooding struck over 10 villages and devastated thousands of people. The disaster caused many farmers to lose their crops for the entire year. Most villages in this area already live in poverty, only planting enough rice for their own consumption. When their crops are lost their livelihood is deeply affected and they lose their food and wealth. Together with our partner, IDES was able to help nearly 2,500 people with emergency relief. The relief has turned the nonbelievers from animosity to friendly relationship with Christians. Even the mayor, who used to persecute Christians, has accepted this help. He viewed Christians in a new light, saying that Christians aren't just all talk, but also show action. They have now experienced Christ's love in a tangible way. No one had ever done this in their village!

Wildfires in Hawaii

In August of 2023, a series of wind-driven, wildfires ravaged the island of Maui in Hawaii, forcing families to evacuate, as their homes and businesses were destroyed. Around 100 people lost their lives to the disasters, but even after the flames were put out, families continued to suffer. Even now, months later, many people have not been allowed to return to their homes, due to hazardous materials in the burned out remains.

By partnering with a local church on Maui, we have been able to come alongside of 26 families with financial needs, who lost either jobs or their homes due to the wildfires. Two people, including a homeowner the church has been assisting, have given their lives to Christ. While there is still an incredibly long recovery ahead, we will continue to provide support to the local churches as they tangibly show the love of Jesus to families affected by this disaster.

Earthquake in Turkey & Syria

On February 6th, 2023, regions of Turkey and Syria experienced a devastating 7.8 magnitude earthquake that took the lives of over 50,000 people, and left an estimated 1.5 million people homeless. But by working with our global partners, IDES helped 39,000 people and provided 375,000 meals.

Atta's family was forever changed from this tragedy. Atta lost his wife, daughter, and son. He and his only remaining daughter, Nojia, are now attempting to rebuild their lives from the ruins. They live in a container in growing "container cities" that give families a temporary place to live while their towns are rebuilt. Noija's college education had to be put on hold to help support her grieving father. Atta's shop was destroyed in the devastation and the family has lost their livelihood. But hope rises from the rubble. Despite the immense sorrow and pain, Atta and Noija have found solace in their faith. After receiving a Bible and prayers, their hope has been rekindled. They express a curiosity to learn more about Jesus and the comfort that their newfound faith brings. They now attend regular meetings that involve spiritual guidance, sharing prayers, and building a foundation for their spiritual journey.

Atta and Noija are just one family's story of the devastation felt but hope revealed. The road to recovery for much of Turkey is still long. Food will continue to be a need as well as trauma counseling for the survivors of the earthquake. Syria has been difficult to reach because of the ongoing civil war in that country. The earthquake has only compounded the problems Syrians were already facing. Please continue to pray for the recovery of both Turkey and Syria.

Port Charlotte, FL

Ashley Leathers used to attend New Day CC in Port Charlotte, FL before deciding to move to Tennessee for a fresh start. That fresh start unraveled after lan, a Category 4 hurricane, damaged her family home where her disabled mom, Grace, and her autistic sister resided. Their roof was damaged by the storm which caused ceiling damage in portions of their home and significant damage to their master bedroom and master bath. When IDES arrived on the scene, the 3 of them were living in makeshift parts of the home that were salvageable. Starting out, Ashley tried to help her mom and sister the best she could by traveling back and forth from Tennessee. Because of all the massive amounts of time off work to help her family, she ended up losing her job and had to move back to Florida.

IDES partnered with a local church to step in and help the family with all the rebuilding of their home. Through that process, the church discovered that the family was 3 years behind on property taxes and was on the verge of losing their house. The church assisted the family with their taxes and IDES worked to repair the home to its full utilization.

During this process, it became clear that the family was not only in need of a repaired house, but a spiritual need for a Savior. Ashley used to attend church, but had never given her life to Christ. After a few weeks, Ashley gave her life to Christ and was baptized. Although disasters are never welcomed, the redeeming power of Christ continues to shine through the darkest of situations.

Medical Care

IDES provides medical supplies, equipment, medications, vitamins, and other materials requested by partners worldwide. Mobile clinics deliver medical, dental, and vision care to underserved communities.

Ambulances for the Kajumilo Church


Imagine experiencing a medical emergency, but there is no 911 to call and no way for someone to come help. This is the case for many villages in Tanzania. When an emergency would happen, the village of Kajumilo had no way of calling for help, receiving immediate care, or having transportation to the nearest hospital. With no immediate care or transportation, injuries often become worse and can even lead to death.

Through the support of IDES, the local church was able to purchase an ambulance and the equipment to treat and move patients. Locals had the opportunity to receive training in first aid and are now able to respond to emergency situations through an emergency call system. The Kajumilo church can now physically and spiritually act as first responders. Not only can urgent medical care be provided, but hope can be given in times of urgent need.

El Salvador Medical Clinic

IDES, along with several other organizations, worked to build a complete clinic out of storage containers in El Salvador. This clinic will provide Help and Hope to a community of approximately 40 villages.

The clinic is a sustainable project to meet the basic medical needs of anyone seeking help. The local government reports that there are approximately 75,000 people needing healthcare in the area. The clinic will be a "first stop" to address illnesses and to help in the prevention of life-threatening conditions that happen when basic symptoms are left untreated. It is a place where patients experience Christ's love firsthand through Christian medical professionals who oversee the clinic.

Hunger Relief

About 820 million people are undernourished globally. IDES supports both long and short term hunger relief efforts. This allows our partners to provide nutritious food for children, widows, and families who are suffering the effects of chronic food insecurity and hunger.

Droughts in Tanzania

Imagine a life where new believers must wait months for the next rainfall to be baptized. This is the reality for new believers in Tanzania. The country has suffered through 6 major droughts in the past 30 years. This drought has been one of the worst droughts to date for Tanzania, making food hard to come by. Through the work of our partners, over a thousand people received corn to help nourish their bodies and open doors to the gospel. The food distribution has increased the faith of many because they have seen that in times of trouble, the Lord sees and provides. One man said "God really does hear me and has not forgotten me." 22 people decided to surrender their lives to Christ and be baptized. However, the drought has meant that there is little to no water for baptisms, let alone to drink.

The "Harvest" in Kosovo

"Harvest of Talents" is a truly incredible event, founded by the late Pat Snyder in 1984. Churches across the midwest donate their talents, in the form of crafts, baked goods, (and other things/services) to raise money for IDES hunger relief projects. This year alone, the six churches who participated raised \$232,707.67, which directly translates to families fed, communities given hope, and thousands of people shown the love of God in tangible, life-altering ways.

In Kosovo, Harvest funds are used to feed families in need, like widows, families with no working-age providers, individuals with physical or mental disabilities, and elderly people with no one to take care of them. And people are noticing. Our partner reported that "They are starting to see that we really do care for them and they are becoming more curious about who we are and why we continue to help them with no

Community Development

IDES works with partners around the world to help people create a better future for themselves and future generations. We give a "hand-up" instead of a "hand-out" like farm developments, water projects, animal husbandry, sewing, and training in skills that allow people to earn a sustainable income.

El Salvador Growth and Nutrition Project

El Salvador has suffered from poverty, oppression, and gang control for years and has left many hopeless for a better tomorrow. Although the country is breathtaking, violence and fear are ubiquitous and leave many families trapped in difficult financial situations. Most children struggle with malnourishment and false teaching is prevalent. Yet, the gospel offers hope to those in the most desperate situations.

Through the support of IDES, our mission partner is working to transform communities through development projects. New farming strategies, like aquaponics and the use of tilapia pools, have produced 10,000 pounds of cucumbers, squash, green beans, corn, and watermelon. These farms supply communities with nutritious foods as well as generate revenue that provide families a way out of poverty.

In addition, small (but mighty) chicken businesses have paved a way for vulnerable community members, usually women and single mothers, to provide for their own livelihood. The business owners are provided with chickens, supplies to raise them, and training in good business practices. So far, 1,500 chickens have been raised!

Marketplace Ministries in Southeast Asia

The heart of IDES is for every person to know Jesus, no matter their place or status in this world. In an unreached village in a remote country in Southeast Asia, this very thing is happening.

An IDES' mission partner is training villagers in new farming techniques and valuable business skills. Many students were once addicted to drugs and had no hope of a future. Now, these rehab students are earning a steady income and being empowered by a new hope. When this project began there were no Christians in these villages. As of a few months ago, there are now 8 Christian families!

Water Well in Kenya

In the U.S., most people have easy access to safe, clean water just from the faucet. But, in Kenya, fetching water means walking nearly 4 miles in the broiling heat through dangerous, snake-infested bush. Even then, the muddy water is usually contaminated with filth, parasites, and water-born illnesses that can cause excruciating sicknesses, even death.


When a local IDES partner built a well in the village, it meant a second chance at life for the community. Having clean and safe access to water means protection from hazardous walks, peace of mind for families needing to provide for their kids, strength, time for children to attend school, and the opportunity for families to sustain small farms.

One community member said this:

"We are so grateful to God for providing a sustainable source of clean water in our village. Access to clean water is the foundation of all development. The lack of a clean, reliable source of water was an insurmountable obstacle for my people.

"We could not help ourselves. No one could grow food. No one wanted to build a house. No one stayed healthy for long. Children couldn't stay in school. We just kept working without water.

"Today, with clean water, the possibility of breaking out of the cycle of poverty in the community is incredibly increased!"

Evangelism & Discipleship

Our primary goal is to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in all that we do. Whether we are providing nutritious foods to the hungry or serving the sick and injured, we strive to show that God loves and cares for those in need.



Motorcycles in India

Motorcycles are essential for spreading the gospel in remote areas. Rather than paved interstates, long dirt roads are often where those who need help & hope typically reside.

Prior to receiving a motorcycle, Amit would travel for hours across India serving 5 different congregations. These congregations consist of people cast out who are extremely impoverished, disabled, widowed, orphaned, and/or have contracted leprosy.

One particular congregation Amit traveled to was a leper colony living in a small shutdown hospital. The two room building was lined with cots and buckets acting as their toilet. Because it took so long for Amit to travel to each congregation, the lepers would wait until dark to have their service. Not only does it take more time, resources, and energy to travel by foot, but cobras that surround the hospital are more likely to strike at night.

Having a motorcycle has made all the difference for Amit and his efforts in serving the least of these. People are receiving vital physical help and new believers are being baptized more and more. He is better able to facilitate food distributions, serve his congregations, and bring help & hope to those rejected by the world, but adored by Christ.

Bibles for Prisoners

IDES partnered with a well-connected prison ministry in the US that provides Bibles to train prisoners in disciple-making. The Bibles along with special intense training give the prison ministry the ability to equip prison leaders to lead the ministry efforts in the prisons where they live 24/7.

50 Churches for 50 Years

This year, IDES launched a new campaign to deliberately focus on planting new churches around the world. In Fall of 2023, we found our first church in northern India. Our partners there are already embedded into the community, and the new church building will allow them to exponentially grow their work. These stories are just a few of the people who will be supported and shown the tangible love of Christ in our first "50 for 50" church.

The Forgotten Woman

"Sarah" has always been poor, but she never let that dampen her spirits. She was a kind-hearted woman who loved to help others, especially children. One day, Sarah noticed a small bump on her arm. She ignored it, thinking it was just a mosquito bite. However, the bump grew into a sore and refused to heal. She soon found out she was suffering from leprosy, but couldn't afford the medication to treat it.

Due to supersticious beliefs about leprosy, Sarah's children and their families abandoned her. She was forced to leave her home and move to the leper colony on the outskirts of the village. She was shunned by society, viewed as unclean, and left to fend for herself as an old woman.

On a regular visit to the leper colony, our mission partner met Sarah. She formed a friendship with Sarah and visited her frequently to clean her wounds, share stories from the Gospel, and feed her. Through the support of IDES, the local church was able to care for her physical needs, which then led to Sarah accepting Christ as her Savior. Though she was abandoned by her children, Sarah now has a Father in Heaven and a family in the church that cares for her.



The Abandoned Mother

A young woman from one of the churches in India was forcibly married at the age of 16 to a much older man. It is customary for women to get married young in village culture of India, and unfortunately, some fall into the wrong hands. Her husband was an alcoholic and eventually deserted her, leaving her pregnant and without any support. Because of her situation, she had lost the will to live and felt stuck in depression and poverty. But God saw her. The community of believers from the area stepped in to show Christ's love and compassion. The community helped her with meals while she was young, without a job, and pregnant. With no means to defend and provide for her unborn child, Christ swept her off her feet through the simple kindness of meals and shelter at the Church premises.

Through the support of IDES and the local church, the young woman was able to receive shelter, food, and support. This woman knows her and her child's life was spared because of the kindness of the local church, the support of IDES, and her loving father in Heaven.


