EVANGELISM & DISCIPLESHIP



E4: Motorbikes - \$1,000

One of the best tools for evangelists are motorbikes. These allow them to get to remote places in countries like Kenya or India. The motorbikes allow them to travel quickly to share the gospel with unreached people in neighboring villages.



E1: Bible/New Testaments - \$20/\$10

DISASTER RESPONSE



D12: Tarp - \$50

Tarps are a precious commodity. After a major storm, volunteers work quickly using tarps to cover roofs to prevent further water damage inside the house. In developing countries, tarps are used in various ways to help improve living conditions.



D8: Storage Shed - \$2,000 or portion \$100/\$500

IDES sheds are built for families to have a safe place to store recovered belongings after a disaster occurs. This program is a tool for the local church to reach out to its own community during a time of need in the name of Jesus Christ.



D1: Blanket/Bedding - \$10

When refugees flee during a disaster, most people escape with very limited possessions. This loss can be devasting. Blankets and bedding are vital to help in the short and long-term recovery efforts.



D11: Tin Sheeting - \$10

In the developing world, tin sheeting is used for roofing, siding, tables, bedding, and flooring. Because it is lightweight, it is easy to get into rural and jungle areas. The low cost also allows us to build more homes and structures quickly after disasters occur.



Since the 2021 earthquake in Haiti, IDES projects with our mission partners in Haiti, have resulted in building 50 brand new homes. "Living out in the open, given Haiti's current volatile climate, isn't safe. Not only are you open to the elements, but you have no barrier between you and others who wish you harm. One family suffered greatly at the hands of violent men. Despite this assault, they are still a joyful family, who believed that God would rescue them. Their brand-new home is redemption, a blessing, a gift, a picture of God's love and His ability to restore!" - Partner in Haiti

The Food and Agriculture Organization estimates that between 691 million and 783 million people were hungry globally in 2022, effectively erasing progress made since 2015. In addition, food insecurity rose from 25.3% in 2019 to 29.6% in 2022, with severe food insecurity affecting 11.3% of the global population. IDES is dedicated to working with our partners around the world supplying food staples like rice, beans, corn, and our GAP meals. Our Harvest of Talents program held annually at 6 different churches raises funds to supply food year-round for several mission partners. We also have our famous blue SonFish Banks which are a fantastic teaching tool for children in communicating the idea of missions and God's love while helping those who are hungry.

NEW CLEAN WATER WELL IN WEST AFRICA

Isaiah and his wife Mary have 5 children and live in a town in a country in West Africa. Isaiah is a shepherd and farmer and his wife manages their home. Our mission partners in this region shared the Gospel of Christ in early 2022. Mary, the wife, and mother, was captivated by the stories of Jesus that she listened to on her audio Bible radio. Her husband Isaiah was more reluctant, but he continued to passively listen in the background from time to time.

This family then started to be part of the house church in their village and after a month's time, Mary decided she wanted to give her life to Christ and be baptized. She wanted her husband to join her, but he was not ready. Mary loved God's word and wanted to be obedient to everything Jesus was asking of her. She was baptized and started to pray for her husband.

Then in the summer of 2022, we joined with our partners and provided a well. Mary shared in a recent interview that "The drilling of the well has greatly impacted their lives." They suffered because of a lack of clean water. They suffered because the water was so far away. The closest well was 14 kilometers from their home.

The lack of water caused sickness, depression, and conflict between families and in the village itself. Mary shared that having clean water right next door that was always available has changed every part of her daily life. Her family is healthier and happier. She has more time with her kids and her husband. Some of their conflicts have been resolved because water is so close. As our partners interviewed Mary and her husband Isaiah, she did most of the talking but as they drew the interview to a close, Isaiah began telling our church planting partner how much this well and the new church have impacted his life over the last 6 months. He told them that he was ready to give his life to Jesus and wanted to be baptized right then and there. And Mary said, "My prayers have been answered."

MEDICAL CARE

We provide medical supplies, equipment, prescription medications, vitamins, and other materials requested by mission partners worldwide. These medicines prove to be an open door to sharing the Gospel. Because of the military coup that took place in 2021 in Myanmar, medicines have become scarce and expensive. The 83 churches in northern Myanmar are in remote areas and were in need of help. IDES partnered with ACM and 13,100 people benefited from the medical kit project. Our partners shared with us that the medical kit program helps their ministry to be more effective. The ancestor worshipers and Naga spirit worshipers have been touched with the love of Christ through the medical kit program. Within two months of receiving the medical kits, a Naga Family, and a Naga young man of the spirit worshipers have come to accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.



M1 Cleft Lip/Palate Surgery - \$300

"Children with facial abnormalities like cleft lip and palate are often shunned by their communities with no hope for a productive future. They have no access to quality medical care in their own countries and no resources to pay for the surgical procedures required to correct their deformities." The grant from IDES offers "free surgical services that restore their features and empower them to return to their communities as welcomed, participating members." - Partner in India
